GEOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT

Structure and Staffing

The Geography Department currently consists of 4 members of staff. One part time post is vacant due to the retirement of the current post holder. Curriculum responsibilities are shared, giving all colleagues the opportunity to be involved in the running of the department.

Facilities and Resources

All members of staff are provided with a laptop and the school makes extensive use of Office 365 and Microsoft Teams. The department's accommodation consists of three teaching classrooms. All teaching rooms are fully equipped with interactive touch screens with audio visual capabilities. The department has easy access to many other facilities in the school such as the reprographics centre, additional computer rooms, and other audio-visual equipment.

Curriculum

Key Stage 3:

In all year-groups, classes are taught as mixed-ability forms with a typical class of 27-30 pupils. The department has implemented a curriculum with an emphasis on skills-based learning. There is an emphasis on engagement and inspiration through active learning with personalised tasks leading to greater individual independence, developing the skills required for pupils of all abilities to approach GCSE Geography with confidence. This is in line with the Ranelagh Learner Profile.

Key Stage 4:

All students are taught in mixed-ability classes using the AQA A Syllabus. Approximately 70 - 100 students take Geography each year.

Key Stage 5:

We follow the AQA Geography course, studying Water and Carbon, Coasts and Hazards for the physical paper 1 and Globalisation and Global Governance, Changing Places and Population & Environment for the human paper 2. Currently we carry out fieldwork at Studland for coasts and Windsor for Changing Places. Geography is a popular choice at A level and we currently have 48 students across the two-year groups.

The Department's Teaching and Learning Ethos

We believe that effective Geography teaching uses a range of approaches to support the progress of individual students regardless of learning styles and ability. We seek to provide an environment in our lessons that is enjoyable, instructive and tailored to the needs of learners as individuals, emphasising knowledge, skills, processes, pace and challenge throughout. Our aim is to educate our children to be confident, self-reliant, interested and knowledgeable in Geography, and to use these skills in their study of all subjects and their future ambitions.
