Foreword - Cllr Daniel Efde

We are pleased to introduce the updated Economic Growth Strategy for Rochford District. Back in 2022 we set out a clear ambition to grow our local economy by supporting businesses, attracting investment and promoting entrepreneurship through enhanced skills and opportunities for our residents.



Much has been achieved since then. This includes the ongoing development of the airport business park, the continuation of the Career Options Employer Showcase in our schools and the delivery of over £1 million in UKSPF funding. This funding has enabled a broad range of projects including direct grants to businesses, expanded training and mentoring opportunities and cultural events that have brought more people to our high streets.

As the national economic landscape continues to shift, we must remain responsive and forward-thinking. This new strategy builds on our progress and ensures that Rochford remains a place where businesses can succeed and residents can access meaningful, high-quality employment. It complements our newly adopted 2024-28 Corporate Plan and 2025-30 Cultural and Visitor Economy Strategy, forming a joined-up approach to delivering long-term prosperity for our District.

National Context

The government's 2024 Modern Industrial Strategy focuses on building a fairer, greener and more innovative economy for the UK. The key elements include:

Public Investment

Calls for a substantial increase in public investment in infrastructure, including transport, housing, and digital networks to drive economic growth and improve connectivity.

2 Regional Economic Growth

Aims to reduce economic disparities across the country by creating a focus on regional hubs and providing tailored support for local economies.

3 Skills and Education

Outlines a plan to upskill workers, improve education and reform vocational training and apprenticeships to help workers adapt to evolving job markets.

4 Innovation and Technology

Promotes the development of high-tech industries like AI, biotech and robotics. The government will invest in R&D to help make the UK a leader in advanced technologies.

5 Green Transition

Prioritises achieving net-zero carbon emissions by 2030, with major investment in green sectors like renewable energy, electric vehicles and carbon capture to create a low carbon economy.

6 Fairer Economy

Focuses on tackling inequality by supporting workers' rights, raising wages and promoting fair business practices, especially in emerging sectors.

Essex Context

The 2023 Essex Sector Development Strategy

focuses on fostering economic growth and innovation in the region by prioritising key sectors such as green energy, advanced manufacturing, digital technology, life sciences and creative industries. It aims to enhance Essex's competitiveness by investing in skills development, particularly through vocational training and apprenticeships and supporting research and development initiatives.





The strategy also emphasises improving infrastructure, such as transport and digital connectivity, while promoting sustainability and environmental responsibility across industries.

By creating a supportive business environment and attracting investment, the strategy seeks to build a resilient, futurefocused economy in Essex that benefits all local communities.

A skilled, adaptable workforce that is ready to meet the demands of future industries, attracting both employers and talent to Rochford District.


4 Sustainability

Key Objectives:




- Continue to work with local schools to ensure that educational programmes align with the needs of employers, particularly in high-growth sectors like technology, green industries and digital services.

- Work with Essex County Council and other providers to offer upskilling programmes for adults to support lifelong learning and career progression, focusing on digital, technical and sustainable skills.

Key Objectives:



- Promote the use of renewable energy sources and energy-efficient technologies in both residential and commercial developments.
- Support businesses in adopting sustainable practices, such as reducing waste, minimising carbon footprints and embracing the circular economy.
- Work with Essex Climate Action Commission and other partners to achieve our aim of being a carbon neutral District by 2040.


