MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Key duties (TA):

- 1. Implement planned learning activities/teaching programmes as agreed with the teacher, adjusting activities according to pupils' responses as appropriate
- 2. Participate in planning and evaluation of learning activities with the teacher, providing feedback to the teacher on pupil progress and behaviour
- 3. Support the teacher in monitoring, assessing and recording pupil progress/activities
- 4. Provide feedback to pupils in relation to attainment and progress under the guidance of the teacher
- 5. Support learning by arranging/providing resources for lessons/activities under the direction of the teacher
- 6. Support pupils in social and emotional well-being, reporting problems to the teacher as appropriate
- 7. Share information about pupils with other staff, parents / carers, internal and external agencies, as appropriate
- 8. Understand and support independent learning and inclusion of all pupils as required.
- 9. Assist in the development of individual development plans for pupils (such as Individual educational plans)
- 10. Support the work of volunteers and other teaching assistants in the classroom
- 11. Support the use of ICT in the curriculum
- 12. Invigilate exams and tests
- 13. Assist in escorting and supervising pupils on educational visits and out of school activities Select, prepare and clear away classroom materials and learning areas ensuring they are available for use, including developing and presenting displays
- 14. Support children's learning through play
- 15. Support pupils in developing and implementing their own personal and social development
- 16. Assist pupils with eating, dressing and hygiene, as required, whilst encouraging independence

- 25. Assess, record and report on development and progress in emotional literacy and wellbeing to staff and parents.
- 26. To work with parents and staff to identify the specific programmes to be delivered through analysis of need.
- 27. Liaise with staff and other relevant professionals and provide information about pupils as appropriate
- 28. Support pupils in social and emotional well-being, reporting problems to the teacher as appropriate
- 29. Provide pastoral care more widely to pupils
- 30. To continue to explore new resources or training to enhance the provision.

Such other duties as may from time to time be necessary, compatible with the nature of the post.
