We are seeking to appoint a talented individual to the post of Senior Teaching Assistant to start in September 2026. The role involves working with the teachers to deliver quality teaching that facilitates independence and progress for our young people. We would also be interested in applications from candidates who have had training or experience with manual handling, or who would be willing to receive training.

The successful candidates will have Level 2 qualifications in English and Mathematics (GCSE Grade C or higher or equivalent). Prospective candidates are advised to study the person specification and job description for this post carefully.

Rise@GHC is a specialist resource provision for learners with Autism living in Bracknell Forest and other local authorities. Rise@GHC opened in September 2015, and was awarded NAS autism accreditation in 2024. There are currently 52 pupils on roll in years 7 -11. Our aim is to provide the specialist and personalised learning, care and support that will enable our pupils to go on to achieve educational and personal success, and progress well to the next stage of their lives; to further education, the workplace or to commence work based training or apprenticeships. The centre is part of Garth Hill College but operates in dedicated buildings within a short walk/drive from our main site. Pupils who attend Rise@GHC belong to the Garth Hill College community, wear the same uniform and benefit from access to facilities at the main site as appropriate.

Our NAS accreditation inspection in July 2024 was very positive and the report highlighted several key strengths including:

*Support enables autistic young people to take part in a range of activities which are purposeful and engaging and which promote their independence and emotional well-being together with their social communication skills.*

*Proactive and preventative strategies are employed to help each autistic individual avoid anxiety or distress and to enable them to understand and regulate their emotions and sensory experiences.*

*A 'pupil first' ethos, the efforts and work prioritise the pupil's wellbeing. Pupils' well-being is a priority. The highly effective pastoral system supports pupils' well-being and mental health.*

*Classroom environments are organised and meaningful to students. The wider personal development of pupils is a strength. The school has put in place a carefully considered programme that runs through the whole school.*
